FINAL PROJECT #1 INSTRUCTIONS: CREATING YOUR OWN AUTOBIOGRAPHY WEB PAGES

STEP 1: You have created four original autobiographical incidents this quarter and you have learned how to work in HTML. This is your opportunity to prove that you have mastered all of the skills you have learned so far and to publish your work. The following is a list of what you must do to complete your final project. Read it carefully, as you are responsible for making sure it is done correctly and turned in on time. If you have any questions, make sure to get them answered now.

Mandatory Inclusion:

Content Criteria

- 1) Title Page with Table of Contents listed
- 2) Links from your Table of Contents to each of your Autobiographical Incident web pages and your About the Author web page
- 3) 4 Formal Autobiographical Incidents (these are the pieces you turned in for a formal letter grade) turned into separate web pages
- 4) 1 About The Author web page
- 5) 6 Captured Images that illustrate the Title Page, the About the Author Page, and all 4 of your Autobiographical Incidents

HTML Criteria

All of the following code must be visible in HTML from the page source and used correctly to create functional web pages:

- 1) <HTML> and </HTML>
- 2) <HEAD> and </HEAD>
- 3) <TITLE> and </TITLE>
- 4) <BODY> and </BODY>
- 5)

- 7) + each of its attributes: SRC, HEIGHT, WIDTH, HSPACE, VSPACE, ALT
- 8) <A> and
- 9) HREF

Miscellaneous

- 1) Points will be taken off for links that do not work properly and for titles in the wrong place.
- 2) Background color must be used effectively on each page to make clear the text and the images.
- 3) All text must be readable no matter the color or the font size.
- 4) Space must be used effectively on the web page to create a page that is visually pleasing and not too stark or too cluttered.

Extra Credit

- 1) More than six images used effectively. They logically depict the text on the page or complement the main idea of that page.
- 2) An image used as a link or a button.
- 3) The use of more than 4 Autobiographical Incidents.
- 4) Any original graphics used to decorate a page.
